

CONSERVATION

- Barrowden was designated a Conservation Area in 1975 and has 55 Listed Buildings, some of Historical importance.
- This status is important. It allows the preservation and protection of Barrowden's character - its architecture , views, landscape, vistas and natural open spaces. This status has an impact on the type, design and materials used for new buildings or extensions .
- Wakerley, though not a Conservation Area has a significant number of Listed buildings of architectural interest and a Grade 1 listed church.
- There are rules and guidelines, for listed buildings that must be followed by law although listing is not a preservation order, preventing change.

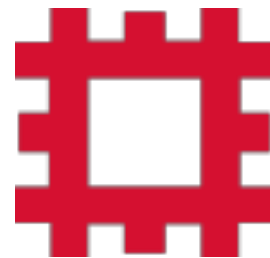
